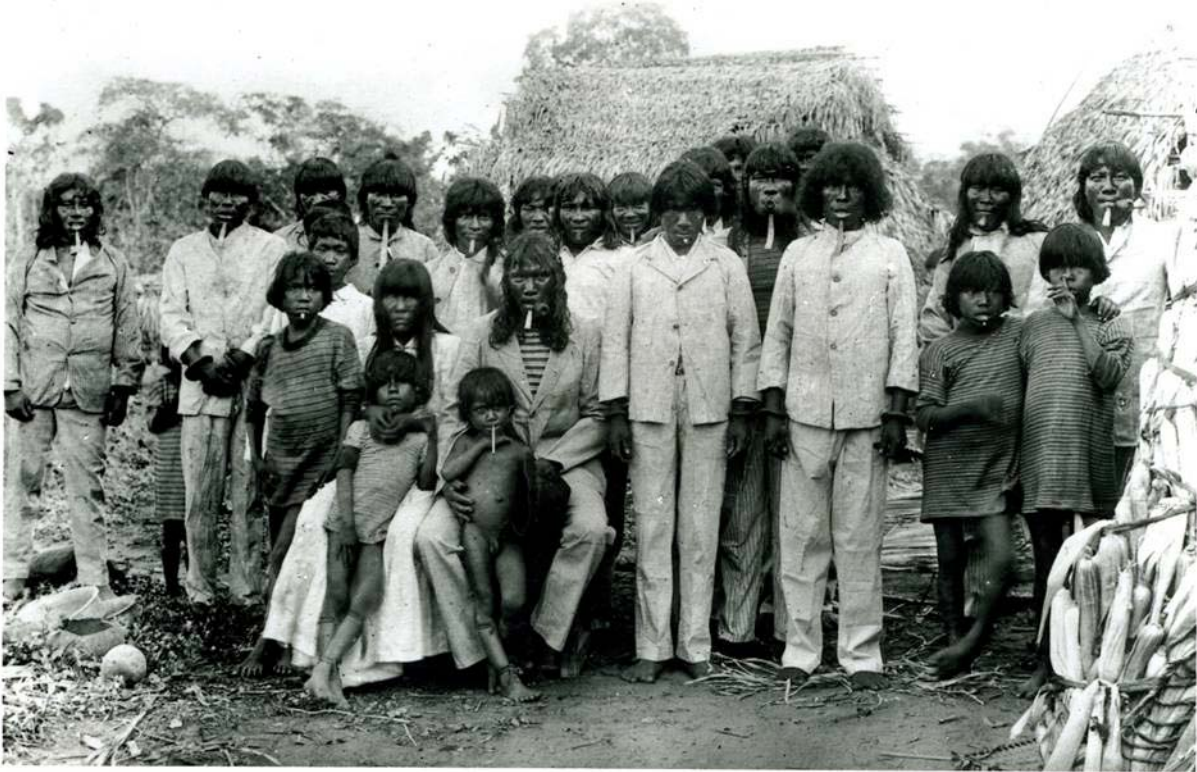

Tracy Devine Guzmán has published in the *Bulletin of Latin American Research* and the *Journal of Latin American Cultural Studies* among others, and was awarded the 2006 Article Prize of the Brazil Section of the Latin American Studies Association. She has also been a political advocate in the Americas since 1993 and has served as a translator and consultant for Save the Children-UK in Perú from 2003 to 2007. Currently she is completing a book manuscript titled “Post-Indigenism: Ethnicity and the Cultural Politics of Nationhood in Latin America.”
